Finding Un-Indexed Records at FamilySearch

FamilySearch has a huge collection of record images but many have not been indexed on-site. Because these records are not 'name-searchable' in the database, researchers need to take a few more steps to find them. Taking the time to learn the steps can save time and result in amazing finds.

FamilySearch volunteers are indexing records on an on-going basis and AI is also being used to scan and generate indexes. The new 'Get Involved' program will focus on the United States Wills and Deeds collection, but it will take some time before all records are entered in the database.

Millions of records digitized from original microfilm are 'browseable' on the FamilySearch site. This session will focus on different ways to access records that are not yet 'name-searchable.'

Next: Select specific item, such as 'Marriage records 1850-1866 (Contains a typed copy (p. 1-28, 105-181) and original manuscript (ca. 130 p.). Both are partially indexed.)

Goal: find an 1850 manuscript (copy of original handwritten) record in item 6

At item 6, go to handwritten book index (image 429)

- 'A' section: Alder, Sanford marriage record is on p. 1
- Browse to the record: image 439 of 503


Step 1: Look for location, San Benito



Step 2: Find type of record & date range (Death Index 1905-1984 vol 2) (Deaths 1984-1986)

Step 3: Look at Book Index (handwritten entries)




• Go to 'G' section and look for last name, note 'Book and Page' of death record Use the window to put in approx. image number (may need to 'page thru' until found) Note: online index at *Ancestry.com* has no page #s

'G section' (image 94 > Griggs) note: chronologically listed



Step 4: Use browser arrow (top left) to return to link (navigate back to collection to find book)

- Find Book 22, then find the death record on image 76 (p. 20)
- View record for genealogical information, document may be downloaded

Exercise 1: Find Death Certificate images, use same link above/same steps as above

- Find death record of Paul Bertuccio, died in 1977, San Benito County, CA (19/89A)
- View record for date of birth, occupation, names of parents, name of surviving spouse

Example 3: Browse Probate Cases, Jefferson County, Alabama, Film #2358370 (direct link below) Note: cases are arranged in alphabetical order by surname

Goal: Find family information re Jeannette Burgin Abbott, minor

Step 1: Go to images 398 and 399 of 1364 to view document

- View and read Sections 5 of document
 - a) How old is the minor child?
 - b) What relationships are shown?

Finding Un-Indexed Records at FamilySearch, p. 4

<u>Step 2</u>: Click on number and then look at list for type of record and date range

Such as:

'Pennsylvania Civil Marriages, 1677-1950'

Pennsylvania Civil Marriages, 1677-1950 Index and images of various city and county marriage records, many from Philadelphia. BROWSE ALL 1,117,101 IMAGES

Collection link

Browse = not all indexed

Note: could check database to see if the record has been indexed

Step 3: Select 'Philadelphia'

Step 4: Select 'Marriage licenses, Marriage licenses, no 306496-306953, 1914' Note: Records are in loose chronological order

Step 5: Find William Charlton and Grace Boyd, married 2 Jan 1914 (image 56-58 of 1640)

C. Search by image groups https://www.familysearch.org/records/images/ (also try new version)

Step 1: 'Explore Historical Images' > enter location such as Mexico

Step 2: 'Search Image Groups'

Step 3: Select from 'Places Within' on screen left (note: some are church names)

• Select: Baja California Sur > Cabo San Lucas > 2003-2004 Death Certificates (filter) Results link https://www.familysearch.org/records/images/search-results?page=1&place=1937053

Step 4: Browse and view documents (in class examples, images 10 & 14)

Example 2: Canada, British Columbia > Life Event: Migration > Alien Records 'K' (image 32)
